



Skipper is the camp dining hall and gathering place in the upper level.



Skipper Downstairs have recently been remodeled especially with youth groups needs in mind. It has 3 large rooms with 12 beds (6 bunk beds), 1 medium size room with 8 beds (4 bunk beds) and one small room with 4 beds (2 bunk beds). The large rooms are great for a group of kids and their counselor or chaperones to share a room for optimal supervision and the small room is great for your event administrative staff that does not need to sleep with the kids. We have also added individual air-conditioning and heating units to each room. There is also a common lounge space with a fireplace and comfy chairs at the end of the hall. Restrooms and showers are two communal gendered spaces at the end of the hall. At this time those restrooms are also used for everyone using the dining hall and also a common accessible restroom to anyone using the site. We are currently planning to add two handicap accessible gender neutral single stall restrooms on the upper level that will be accessible from both outside and inside the building.



Memorial Lodge has two stories that are able to be rented separately. The primary difference is that the upstairs is equipped with a small "galley style" kitchen that groups can choose to prepare their own food. The lower level does not have this and groups are encouraged to choose the camp food service.

Both floors have a spacious gathering area with comfortable seating around a fireplace as well as small tables and chairs.

Both floors also have 4 bunk rooms. 2 on each floor have 5 bunk beds and 2 on each floor have 4 beds. Each room has an individual restroom with a toilet and shower with the sink in the main bunk room.

At this time the capacity for each floor is 36, if all of the beds are in use.



Heritage is also known as "the barn". It was the original barn for the farm when the property was purchased. It has been remodeled as a very comfortable gathering and bunk house while retaining some of the original barn structure. It is perfect for small adult or family groups. There is ample space to gather around the fireplace, in comfy chairs and couches, around the dinner table, or outside on the porch. There is also an open basement multipurpose space. Heritage has 6 sleeping rooms. Two of them are like the photo on the left and have one queen size bed as well as a bunk and single bed, sleeping up to 5 and great for a family unit. The other four rooms are like the photo on the right and currently have 4 single beds. Soon one of these single beds in each of these rooms will be a bunk bed. So total sleeping capacity is currently 26 and soon will be 30.



The Parker Ridge Cabins are a short walk up the path from Skipper. There you will find 5 cabins named after camp donors: Parker, Wealand, Kropf, Westminster, and West Park. All cabins sleep about 12 in bunk beds, have 2 toilets, 2 showers, 2 sinks, simple heating, and electricity. These are great "three season" cabins.

Parker and Wealand have been recently remodeled to include synthetic wood laminate floors, a large picture window, a dorm size refrigerator and microwave oven.


Each cabin is rented individually making them an affordable and great choice for individuals, families or smaller groups.



There is a "director's cabin" on each side of camp. The red cabin is the South cabin and is located near Parker Ridge and the other one is the North cabin and is near 6 cabin hill.

Both cabins have two toilets, showers and sinks in the cabin, along with about 5 bunk beds and electricity. The South cabin is has a ¾ length wall between the two sides with an open area before the door. The North cabin is actually two rooms with separate doors to the outside. Each side has it's own shower, toilet and sink.

These cabins are also individually rentable and would be perfect for small groups, families or individual retreat. No cooking space is currently provided.



6 cabin hill is available during the summer months for those who want to experience more of God's creation by staying deeper in the woods! There are three sets of cabins, Hawthorne Hollow, Oak Slopes, and Cherry Hill. Each cabin has 6 bunk beds sleeping 12 total with electricity. This would be a great space for a summer youth group retreat. Cabins are rented in pairs.

There are two newly renovated bath and shower houses with toilets, showers and sinks located in the center of the cabin area between each pair of cabins.



There are many activities groups can provide leadership own their own such as hiking, sports and games, and more. Weather permitting groups may register for staff to lead specialized activities like archery or canoeing at camp for an additional charge.
